

"Whoosh" [Lonnie Johnson: Creator of the Super Soaker!]- 4th grade lesson plan

As a boy, Lonnie Johnson, could never find enough room around the house to put all the spare parts he used for tinkering. He loved building, creating, and experimenting. From launching homemade rockets at school to nearly catching his mom's kitchen on fire, he would try one thing after another. He wanted to be an engineer, however, test results showed that he might not be a very good one, but he didn't let that discouragement stop him. He worked hard and later became an engineer for NASA, where, along with many other things, helped design the probe that traveled to Jupiter for exploration.

Before long, Lonnie had a big workshop and lots of ideas flowing. While tinkering with another invention, Lonnie came across a fun way to blast water. He designed and built a prototype water gun. He tried and tried to get a toy company to make it, but that idea, along with many of his other ideas, soon fell apart, and Lonnie found himself and his family having to leave their home. Lonnie had dealt with challenges before. He knew a lot about problem solving and still believed in his inventions. He continued to work hard, and in time that hard work helped him succeed!
